In 2019, the trucking industry was responsible for moving 70% of all goods within the U.S., with trucking revenues accounting for 80% of the nation's freight bill. Trucks also moved 67.7% of surface freight between the U.S. and Canada, plus 83.1% of cross-border trade with Mexico in the same year. In 2020, there were more than 124 million full-time employees in the United States, with 7.65 million of those employed in the trucking industry, not including self-employed workers. The truck driving program teaches you the fundamentals of truck operation, safety and government regulations and necessary recordkeeping. During the program, students take the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles Commercial Driver's License exams allowing them to gain a Class A Commercial driver's license to operate a semi over the road. Our instructors understand the critical nature of the industry and are dedicated and passionate about the success of students. This program builds a strong foundation for students, preparing them for a successful start in the industry.

SCC's program is ranked 4th in the nation for truck driving schools because of our graduation rates and safety ratings. Our program is one of the only schools to have a manual vehicle to test in, and we have a large fleet of truck tractors for students to gain hands-on learning.

The SCC Experience

- » SCC's Professional Truck Driver Training program works in cooperation with donation distribution centers across Nebraska to haul goods between various locations. Each class participates in two to three live loads, giving students real experience prior to completing the program!
- » The Professional Truck Driver Training program theory course meets the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) and HAZMAT Theory requirements. After successful completion of this course, students can complete skill and driving training and testing through SCC or another third-party tester, including your local DMV.
- » Students have the opportunity to train on a variety of equipment to prepare them for any job. SCC regularly gets new equipment for our students to train on and also is one of the only schools with manual transmissions available for student learning.
